- ❖ I hope that there will still be new members joining our congregation.

- ❖ I hope we keep centered on Jesus and are willing to go wherever the Spirit leads.
- ❖ I hope that our Order can grow in its thinking to focus less on diminishment and more on what it can do today.
- ❖ I hope that our community will continue its renewal and commitment to living the vows more deeply.
- ❖ I hope we focus on abundance instead of scarcity through collaboration.
- ❖ I hope that we can address climate change and its effect on the poorest among us.
- As we decrease in numbers, I really hope that we can remain open to the Spirit's call to be in service of the poor.
- ❖ I hope that we are meeting the needs of low-income families, especially those impacted by immigration and socioeconomic disparity.
- ❖ *I hope that we will be a sign of hope and voice against injustice.*
- ❖ I hope we continue to serve directly among the young and not get caught up in administration, that we find ourselves more present to the young online.
- ❖ I hope we dream bigger and open new ways of doing things.
- ❖ I hope we become more intentional about living simply. We have many institutionalized ministry settings that tend to be materially comfortable.
- Our future looks promising. I hope that my institute would be more daring in its ministry.
- ❖ I hope we become a real centralized source of Catholic culture for the local area.
- ❖ *I hope that our focus will be on the quality of the ministry and not the quantity of members.*
- ❖ I hope that even as our members age and the numbers decline, we will be more intentional in the way we live our community life.
- ❖ I hope that we embrace cultural diversity and not only talk about it.
- ❖ I hope that we can focus as much energy on the mission and members in full-time ministry as much as we do on the aging and grieving of the death of members.
- ❖ I hope we find new expressions of our charism to meet the needs of our culture.
- ❖ My greatest hope is that we continue to respond to the needs of God's people with creative hope by thinking outside the box of "what has been" to "what could be."
- ❖ I hope we can renew the fidelity to our call, to become whom we claim to be!
